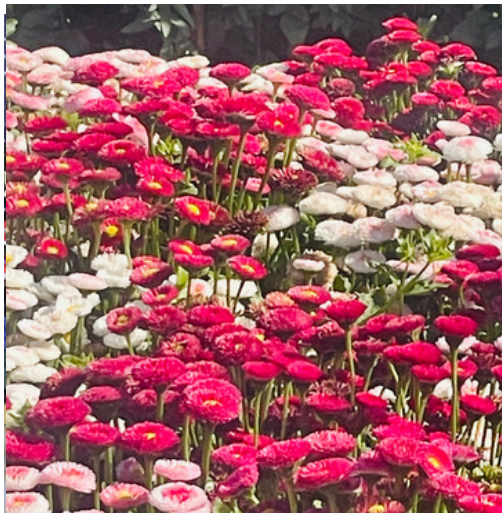

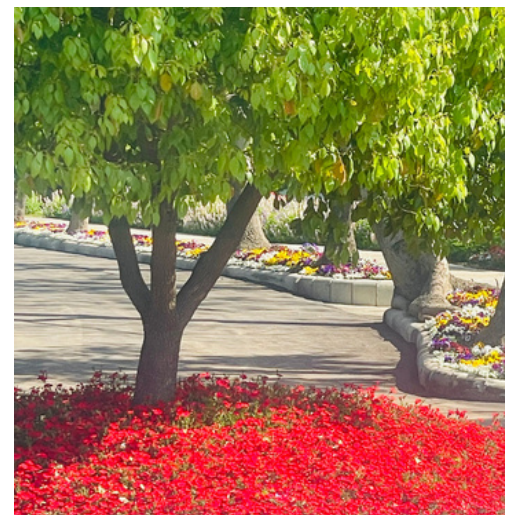
GOD ISA SUPREME PAINTER

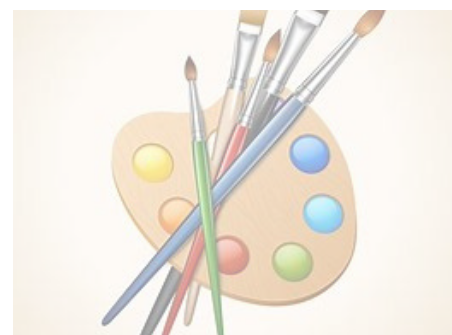
Imagine this: a flurry of paintbrushes transforming eager faces into vibrant representations of India's wildlife wonders. It was a sight to behold.
